

Cover Image: The image shows a trade scale discovered in the ancient Sultanhani caravanserai along the Silk Road in Anatolia. On one side of the scale rests a shekel weight, pressing down the pan. These shekels were marked with numbers indicating how many units they represented. Dishonest merchants would sometimes alter or undercut these inscribed weights to cheat buyers. The prophet Amos condemns this very practice, declaring that the poor were being defrauded in the marketplace (Amos 8:5).
