



2026 ALTAR FLOWER SIGN-UP ARE NOW OPEN



WARMING SHELTER MEALS

Once again, we seek to participate with others in our community and to provide for the needs of our unsheltered neighbors through the La Crosse Warming Center, which operates from November 1 to May 1. We are scheduled to provide meals on the 2nd and 3rd Sundays of every month. The open dates are:



Here is how to get involved:

- Sign up in the narthex to provide an evening meal on the dates we have reserved:
 - o The 2nd and 3rd Sundays of every month.
 - Prepare a meal for 20, or if you prefer, take both slots and prepare for 40.
 - o A meal includes an entree, salad or veggies, and a dessert. There is no need to include milk as it is being provided by a congregation member each week.
 - When preparing a meal, items may be available for free from the Hunger Task
 Force. Tell them you are prepping a meal for the Warming Center.
 - It is best to deliver in disposable containers.
 - o Please drop off the meal by 6:30 pm at 413 s. 3rd Street, La Crosse.
 - You would be welcome to stay and help serve the meal, but it is not required.
 - Be creative. Make it a potluck with others in your family or social group or sponsor a catered meal (think pizza, Festival favorites, or other, unlimited ideas).
