In days of uncertainty—in times when fear sits close & hope feels far—God's people waited for God to speak by an angel of hope.



Jesus calls us to love and care for those who have less than we do—this is a beautiful way to live out that calling.


How it works:

That's it – easy as pie! Thank you for helping make this family's Christmas a little brighter and filled with love and hope.




Let's Build a Community One Connection Group at a Time!
