Light Bearer: O God, we light the third candle of Advent & name it Joy.


We seek the joy You give joy even when we are afraid, joy leaps in us like Elizabeth's child leapt.


IT'S AN ALL-CHURCH EVENING AT ROTARY LIGHTS


Participant Arrival Time: 4:15 p.m. Pageant Start Time: 5:00 p.m.
